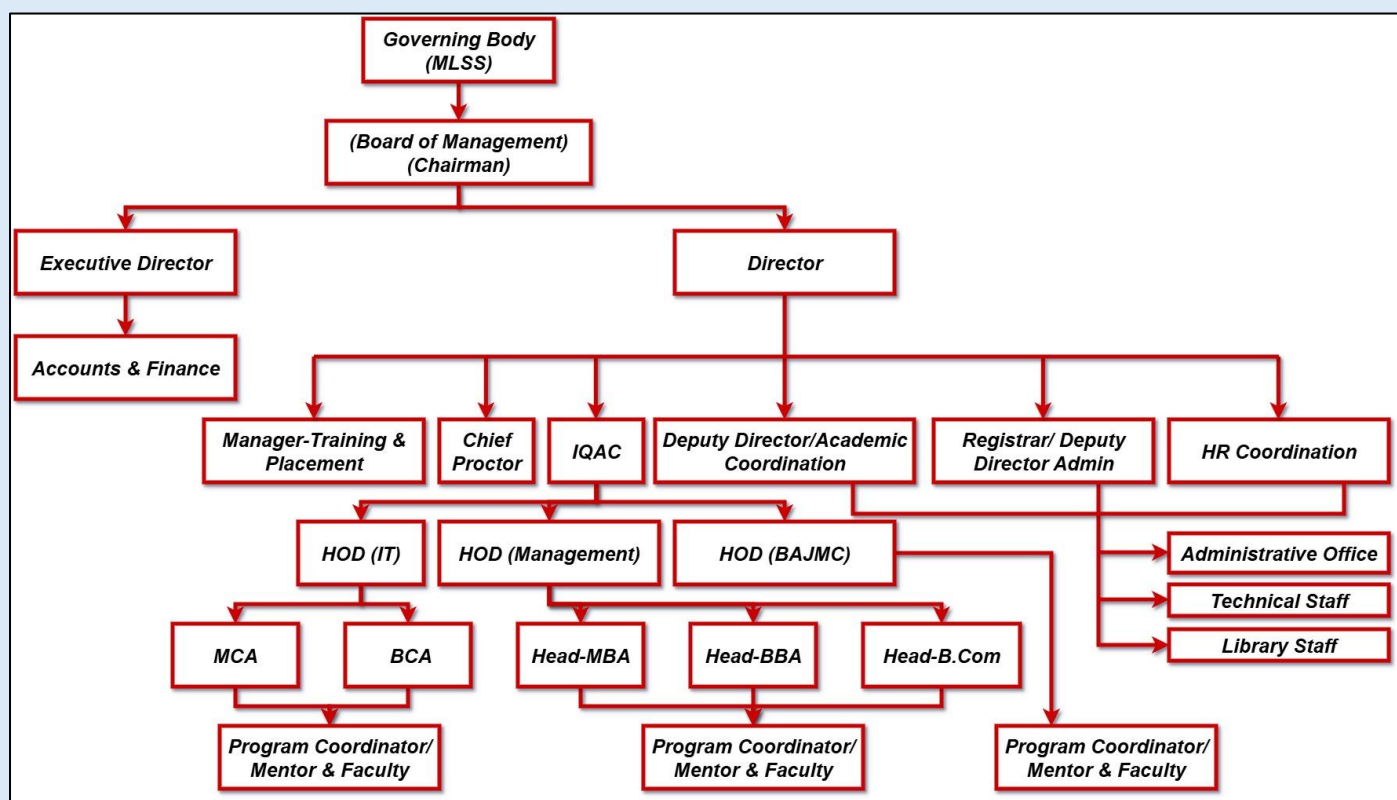

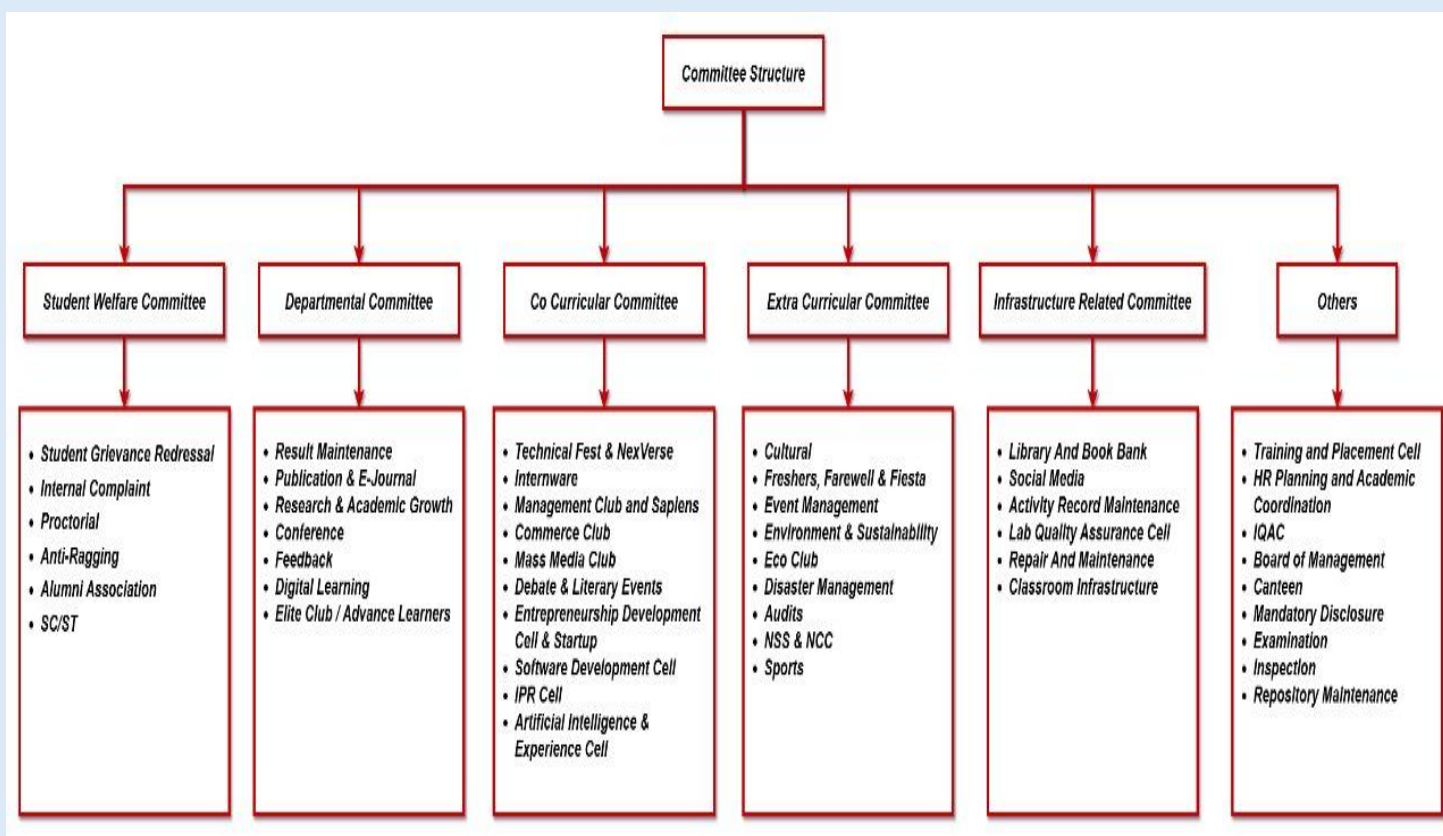
Administration

IQAC

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell has successfully submitted the Annual Quality Assurance Report (IQAR) for the session 2020-21. A NAAC review meeting was conducted to analyze the quality gaps as identified in the NAAC cycle 2 in which the institution has been awarded an “A” grade. This year marked the addition of eminent external experts such as Prof. (Dr.) A.K Saini (Dean, USMS, GGSIPU) & Prof. (Dr.) P.S Grover (Retd. Dean/Director, Department of Computer Science, Delhi University) to IQAC. The IQAC has conducted 21 meetings ever since its inception in 2014 during the NAAC cycle1.

Teaching Learning Pedagogy (OBE)



The Institute has implemented "**Outcome Based Education (OBE)**" and takes pride in developing the necessary manpower and infrastructure to implement Outcome Based Education effectively. The process involved restructuring of curriculum, assessment and reporting practices in education to reflect the achievement of high-order learning and mastery rather than the accumulation of course credits. Thus, the primary aim of OBE is to facilitate desired changes within the learners, by increasing knowledge, developing skills and/or positively influencing attitudes, values and judgment. OBE embodies the idea that the best

way to learn is to first determine what needs to be achieved. Once the end goal (product or outcome) has been determined the strategies, processes, techniques, and other ways and means can be put into place to achieve the goal. Hence in a sincere bid to align itself to the quality requirements of NBA and NAAC the institution restructures its teaching pedagogy to render

each academic activity outcome based. A dedicated academic staff implements the OBE teaching- learning process at IITM through rigorous planning, keeping in view the industry needs. Students undergo classroom lectures, tutorials, case studies, assignments, seminars, workshops, multimedia presentations, and expert lectures by eminent personalities from the industry and academia. A unique personality development module has been introduced within the syllabi to develop the soft skills of the students.
